We are thankful again to have the Toi Foundation as our major funding provider for the next two years along with and many other loyal funding providers. This has left the trust in a strong financial position looking ahead for the next two years at least.

We have continued this year with our Government contracts for ESW and EIT and thankfully these are fully funded therefore not putting any pressure on our delivery of Conductive Education.

We now have Renee fulltime as CEO following the transition with Craig. She is leading a wonderful and loyal team of workers which continues to grow with the organisation. Thank you to all our staff, trustees and volunteers, who have done an outstanding job over the past year, and I look forward to working with you over the next year.


